At first glance, there's no clue to Mark Johnson's story. He's a regular guy living where he was born and raised, who "had it made" at 21. Then his life turned upside-down. Nine months into a sawmill job Mark really liked, he was trapped in heavy machinery and nearly died.

"I was cleaning scraps of wood from a conveyor belt under the wood chipper when my left arm was caught in the moving roller," says Mark. He screamed, but no one heard because of the noise of the machinery.

"After maybe 20 minutes, I was passing out from blood loss. I knew I'd die if someone didn't help me, so I threw up a prayer to God," Mark remembers. Miraculously, the conveyor belt stopped on its own, though no one had touched it.
